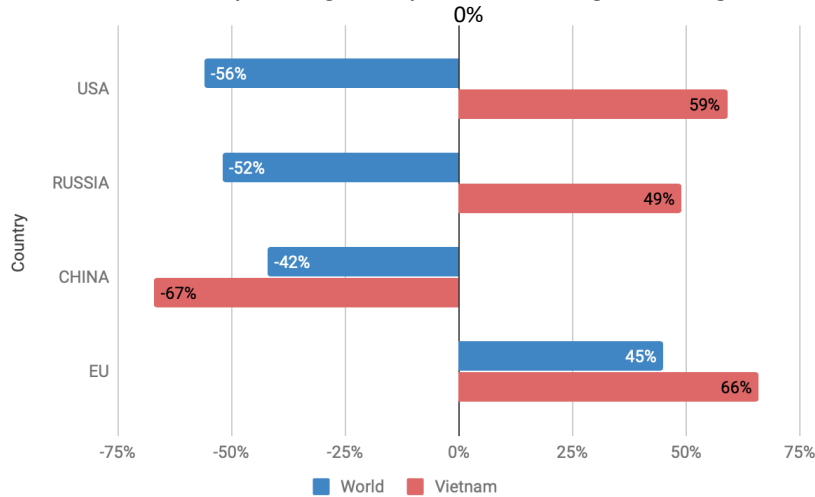

SUPERPOWERS' POLICIES EVALUATION IN THE WORLD AND VIETNAM

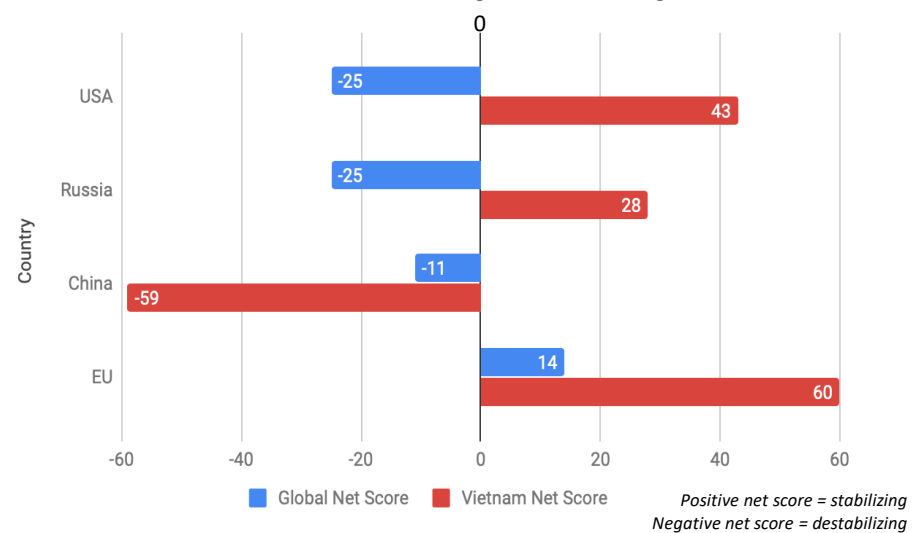
- There are opposite perception on the foreign policies impact of the USA and Russia between Vietnamese answers and the rest of the world.
- China is strongly seen by Vietnamese as a destabilizing power while the EU is perceived as a stabilising one.

The European Union is globally perceived as the most stabilizing force in the World and has positive net scores in all surveyed regions except Russia and West Asia. With the world agreeing moderately to this statement, Vietnam's survey results show an impressive number of 66% of the population finding EU's international policies as stabilizing the world.

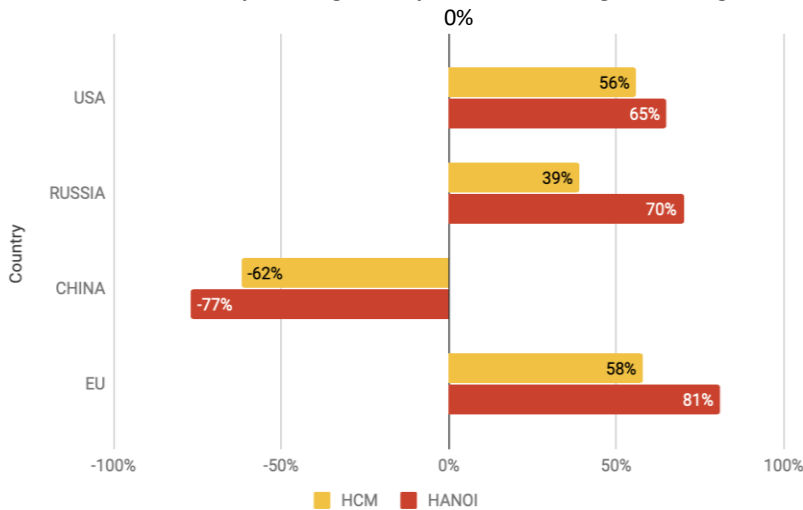

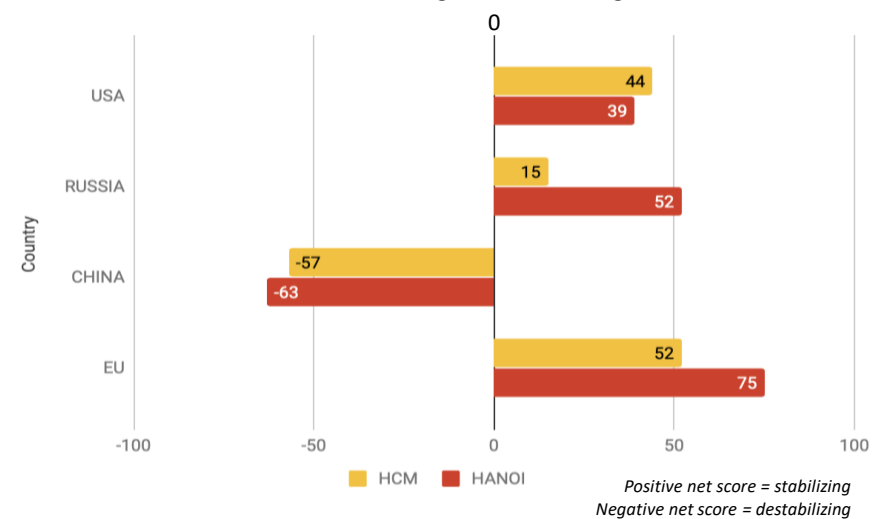
Superpowers policies perception in Vietnam 2 Key cities

- Results in two Vietnamese key cities show approximatively the same answers among respondents. The only notable difference can be seen with Russia, where 70% Hanoians think its international policies are stabilizing compared to only 39% for Ho Chi Minh City residents.
- Another point that stands out is the prominence of « don't know/no response » answers within the Ho Chi Minh City interviewees. Indeed, the percentage of these answers averages between 32% when asked whether USA's international policies are stabilizing and up to 37% when asked about Russia.
- China is the only superpower which international policies are unanimously seen as « destabilizing » from Vietnamese respondents.
